



CONVICTED SEX OFFENDERS WHO WORKED AT NEW HAVEN RTC

Content warning: *This discusses sexual abuse and rape of minors*

The following are individuals who worked at New Haven RTC who have been convicted of sex crimes. Please note that this list does not include individuals who were charged with sex crimes that did not result in a conviction and/or cases where the family settled outside of court and signed an NDA

Jason Scott Calder

Jason Scott Calder was a therapist who worked at New Haven RTC's Hobble Creek campus. He sexually abused a 16-year old at least 10 times while the minor was under his care at New Haven RTC. In 2017, he was arrested on 17 felonies including rape and forcible sexual abuse. In January of 2018, Calder was sentenced to 5 years to life in prison.

Daniel John Stutz

Dan Stutz began working at New Haven RTC in 2014 as a science teacher. He was arrested in 2020 on four counts of first-degree aggravated sexual abuse of a child. At least 7 family members had been abused by Stutz. In March of 2023 he was sentenced to 10 years to life in prison.
